DARS 1 – INTRODUCTION & THE SEVEN CONDITIONS FOR PARTICIPATION 09-11-2011

After praising Allaah and sending salaah and salaam upon His Messenger and those who followed him, our noble *Shaykh* and teacher, Mohammad Al-Malaki *hafidhuhullaah* welcomed the brothers and sisters to the course, “The Key to Knowledge.” Today we are starting the second session of this course after having completed the first one which was about the *`Aqeedah* or Creed. CONDITIONS FOR PARTICIPATION

Indeed, learning the Arabic language depends upon how much the person uses it, as well as how much he avoids the usage of other languages whilst using the Arabic language. Therefore, we have seven conditions for anyone who would like to participate in this session of the course. These conditions are as follows:

1. **The one who wants to apply for this course must have some basic principles of the Arabic language.**
2. **The ability to read the Arabic alphabets and be able to pronounce them correctly from their proper *makhaarij* (articulation point).**
3. **The ability to understand Arabic through listening.**
4. **The ability to understand from reading the Arabic texts – even if it is a little.**
5. **The ability to speak the Arabic language – even if very little.**
6. **The student must have Arabic Windows installed to be able to communicate should something be written in Arabic text on the screen.**
7. **The constant attendance to the classes which will take place from Saturday to Tuesday between 12 (midnight) – 1 AM (Saudi time).**

Students who have applied must meet all of the conditions listed above.

ADDITIONAL COURSE INFORMATION

- ❖ Exams and certificates will only be given to those who are registered to the course. Others who have not registered are more than welcome to attend and listen and benefit, but attendance is not mandatory for them nor will they be required to sit for the exam, nor will they receive a certificate.
- ❖ In this course, we will only use and explain the text of *Al-Aajroomiyyah* but not the explanations of *Al-Aajroomiyyah*. The first source for the explanation that will be presented is the *Qur’aan* and after that the *Sunnah*, then from the many different books which explain *Al-Aajroomiyyah*.

- ❖ Students who would like to own an explanation of the book of *Al-Aajroomiyyah* for their own benefit, there is no problem with that; however, he or she must not take that book as reference and then blame us based on it.
- ❖ We will begin using some English in the first two or three weeks, but gradually we will come to avoid it until we use Arabic only. This may seem difficult, but by the will of Allaah, it will become very easy. For certainly, when a person becomes familiar with something, he will find it to be easy.

We now end by praising Allaah and sending salaah and salaam upon the Messenger of Allaah.
